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COURSE DESCRIPTION :

Our Language Arts (English and Literature) courses are designed to reinforce major content skills in grammar, composition and reading necessary to promote student mastery in reading elements, writing strategies, listening, speaking, and information resources. The course promotes critical thinking by introducing students to structured thinking models, novel reading, and analyzing multiple literary forms. It also identifies an approach that identifies grammatical errors and corrects them in writing pieces to enhance students' writing skills.

GENERAL GOALS AND EXPECTATIONS :

The goal of this course is to tap into and build upon prior knowledge and open new avenues by which students learn. It is also having the opportunity to develop other avenues that give students a new and more positive attitude toward Language Arts and Literature so that they become life-long learners. To obtain these goals, students need to fully participate in the learning process. Therefore, it is imperative that students complete all assignments and prepare for all quizzes and tests.

In addition, students are responsible for their own individual behavior.
